Our love and Best Wishes Alli & Ken xx Memories of a pantomime tour with Jeannine Ridha! By Stuart Williams.

In November 2002 I walked into rehearsals for a pantomime tour I signed up to with a company called Chaplins and the show was 'The Woodcutter and The Wolf'. I was tasked to play the role of Gordon the Woodcutter and on my first day of rehearsals I met my co-star, leading lady and pantomime dame, Mrs Rummbletummy, an exciting role played by the one and only Jeannine Ridha!

Jeannine and I hit it off straight away. I was charmed by her friendliness, her enthusiasm for the show and her work ethic by getting into learning the part and the show so quickly. It was hard work but felt like fun from the start because working with Jeannine was so easy and we had a shared focus on making the show as good as possible.

After rehearsing for one week, which is typically short for small scale touring theatre, we then began our tour around the North West of England. Our tour would usually involve early morning starts at 5-6am with usually 2 hour drives to our selected venues which would be schools in the morning and working man's clubs in the afternoon. We had a very busy working day! Our show would last for one hour and we would be busy behind the scenes changing the music, changing the set, and altering costumes and generally as busy as possible.

Now, anybody involved in theatre will understand the concept of a quick change.

We had an amusing moment in the show about this that Jeannine and I often laugh about!

Whilst playing Mrs Rummbletummy, Jeannine had a quick change into a different character costume and needed my help to do this, which I was happy to do but the problem was that I would be on the musical controls for the pantomime sound effects and needed a cue when to move and help her. So, to get my attention, Jeannine came up with a perfect answer.

When the time in the show came, she ran backstage and said in loud voice:

"Stuart, pull my knickers down I need a quick change!!!"

She is also very kind, thoughtful and generous and having worked with many actors over the years, she is one of the most precise and conscientious performers I've known. Those are skills that cannot be taught and are key to her popularity with other performers and directors, because when you've got Jeannine on board a production, you've got somebody who is, 'the real deal'.

Jeannine, congratulations on your wonderful achievement of fifty years in theatre.
